

They recently packed up their family of five (they have two daughters and one son) and moved to Indianapolis, IN. Basing out of an established local church, they are developing a church plant in the inner city which is set to launch in spring of 2020.

"We have seen God answer so many prayers already. We started building a core team in October and already it has grown beyond what we anticipated. Our relationship with the school board has been amazing and they even made suggestions on which rooms would work best for certain aspects of the church plant!"

Joe and Rebekah are excited about the future and are expecting that God will continue to open doors that they haven't even considered yet. Their main prayer is that God's power and presence would be evident in the launching process of this church plant and that the core families already assembled would grow and mature both in their faith and in their relationships with each other.

South Region Champions Honored at Halftime of Season Opener


